

DIRECTORS REPORTS FOR 2024

CHIEF EXECUTIVE:

In this report, I would like to look back both on the year that has been and look forward to the future of the GBDF.

Overall, 2024 has been a bit of a mixed year for the GBDF.

On the upside, we have made great strides forward in getting the GBDF ready for the future, with the introduction of an EDI policy, the release of regular newsletters, and of course our amazing new logo (see above). Not to mention a more active and relevant presence on various social media. Additionally, we are well advanced in the process of moving our organisational structure from a Federation to a Community Interest Company (CIC). We hope to complete this process around April 2025. The main benefit of becoming a CIC is that it will allow the GBDF to reduce our insurance fees, so that we can better maintain our bank balance without having to increase our membership fees too much. Moreover, the use of the electronic dive recording system and live scoreboards has now become fully embedded and standard practice in the GBDF. This in turn has allowed us to expand the pool of volunteers who support during events with tasks like admin, announcing and recording. Plus our events seem to be gaining in popularity, with the most recent Winter Masters being over subscribed.

On the downside, we have not been able to fill all the positions on the Board this year. And moreover some of the existing Directors are planning to resign, which means there are a lot of empty positions that must be filled if the GBDF is to continue its operations, or even expand them as the Board is hoping to do (for instanced by organising dive camps in addition to the two competitions we run annually at the moment). And while we now seem to have sufficient (and very enthusiastic) volunteers to run our events 'on the day', we are short of volunteers who are able to help out between events in areas like insurance, modernizing the website, fundraising, welfare and safeguarding, etc. And while our own GBDF events are always well-attended, one trend that has been noticed is the reduction of GBDF members taking part in international competitions like the World or European Championships. That being said: we always have some of our members present to represent Great Britain and often bring home medals. So congratulations to all divers who took part in these and other international events like the Croatian Masters Diving Festival and PSV Masters Diving Cup in the Netherlands, etc.

All in all, despite the few causes for concern mentioned above, it is amazing what the GBDF has managed to achieve in 2024, especially considering the small number of Directors who were the driving force behind everything. This gives me great hope for the future, as it

seems that as long as we have sufficient members willing to step up there is nothing that a willing and dedicated Board can't achieve.

And finally, I want to say a massive thank you to all our members, whether they are divers, coaches, judges, volunteers or fellow Directors on the Board, for their commitment to diving and their support for the GBDF.

The GBDF really is a community of divers for divers, which explains the excellent atmosphere and success of our events.

This Equality, Diversion and Inclusion (EDI) policy, recently agreed by the Board, was designed to reinforce two key principles: that discrimination and hate crime have no place in the GBDF or at GBDF events, and that reasonable adjustments will be considered to support competing athletes with impairments or disabilities.

ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR:

2024 was the first year of using an electronic membership form to collect members' information. It took a little effort to get everyone to complete the form, but we got there in the end. By completing a membership form annually, we keep up to date with any changes in email addresses, contact numbers and home addresses. There were a few changes to details for existing members.

By the end of 2024 we had 100 members. These members were all 16 years of age and older. There had been a few under 16 members enrolled at the beginning of 2024, but these were refunded as we have not been in a position to hold junior/novice (under 16) events. We lost eight members as a result of this process.

Out of the 100 members, 95 were full year members (joined before 1 July, 16+) and five joined 1 July onwards (half year members, 16+).

So far, at 21 February, 64 have completed the membership form, with 43 making membership payment. Where clubs make payment on behalf of their members, these are traditionally received once collected from their members, normally around February (currently waiting for payments from Dive London and Plymouth Diving Academy).

Memberships generally increase by the time Spring Masters entry date has expired (as members join at the same time as entering the competition) and again by Winter Masters (for those who are either new, or decide only to pay for half year membership because they are only entering Winter Masters). Our figures are also boosted by one-off memberships where people join only because it is a requirement of the competition that they are covered by our insurance.

Below is a breakdown of previous years membership, along with this year's paid memberships at 21 Febraury 2025:

Would like to thank everyone for taking onboard the changes made in collecting information via electronic membership form, as well as electronic forms for competition entries and medical forms. As mentioned last year, this lets us collect information quickly and easily, but it also helps to keep costs down by not having to post out paper forms; or print off returns. Our next challenge is to encourage everyone to renew their memberships each year because they want to belong to the GBDF family, rather than because they need to be a member to take part in a competition.

FINANCE DIRECTOR:

GDBF Financial Report for Financial Year 2024- C. Moore

BANK BALANCES

1. Main Account

The balance at the end of 2024 stood at £11,860.36, compared to figures for previous years as in the table below. *Full statements have been reviewed by the accountants by way of independent review.*

Payments have been made for Insurances, Swim England affiliation as well as additional fees this year for solicitors advice on change of status to CIC which I believe largely accounts for the reduction in the balance since end 2023.

2. Badge Scheme balance

The balance remains the same as the opening balance i.e. £3,182.99, with no transactions throughout this financial year.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership numbers for the last 3 years are as follows. Membership has reduced in 2024. Therefore, have been some reimbursements for under 16 memberships.

EVENTS

Two events were held in 2024, Spring and Winter Masters.

1. Masters Events

a) Spring Masters (Plymouth)

This event was in loss by £1354.19, with pool hire of £3300 and entries value £2414, only £158.81 of hotel, travel and expenses to meet but high medal costs of £416.31 (included synchro events).

b) Winter Masters (Southend)

This event was in profit by £1857.42, with pool hire at £950, greater value for entries of £3713, late entry fees £40, additional income via programmes (£36), shammies (£90). There was £401.79 of accommodation, travel and expenses to meet. Expenses Shammies £34.29, with medals high cost at £635.50.

ANNUAL COSTS

Membership fees received for the year 2024 i.e. paid end December 2023 and throughout 2024, totalled £2,414.50 including non-member fees. Annual costs for insurances, Swim England, additional legal advice etc were £3967.99, so a deficit of £1553.49 (2023 was £758.29 and 2022 at £981.82). We have reduced the deficit in 2024 by not renewing Swim Alliance annual fee and increasing membership fees. However we have increased it because of unusual solicitors fees associated with an intended change in legal status.

Annual costs will be reduced once we achieve CIC status as we can drop Directors & Officers cover and we have intended to drop accident cover for a while as it offers little to no value and some members have double cover through Swim England or other.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

This report is subject to Independent Review by accountants for recording and any regulatory purposes. However, this does incur an annual fee in the region of £300.

NOW AND THE FUTURE

In 2024, we are £503.23 in profit on events (in loss past years: £25.76 last year and £115.60 2022), though to maintain this we need to increase sales at Winter Masters, membership fees (including non member fees) are not covering annual costs. However, fees have already been increased for 2024 so we will monitor this and see if there need to be further increased charges for long-term sustainability for the Federation.

The deficit on membership fees and annual costs (over £1500) is largely owing to the solicitors fees of £1265. However, it is clear GBDF will greatly benefit from the move to CIC status and being able to drop insurance covers (accident and D&O total cost £392 and £569.23 totalling £961.23). if we can move to CIC status in effect for 1.4.25 then we can claim back some of these costs of 2024.

Factors to consider:

- 1. Rising costs:
- a) The on-going increase of running costs, which need to be reflected against inflation, e.g. pool, general expenses, event-related expenses. Southend, the cheapest option by far is increasing again for 2025 (we are paying large pool hire x 2 and not using Southend. This needs to be heavily borne in mind this year. We may sustain a heavy loss overall on events!
- b) GBDF may wish to make purchases in future such as electronic J-pads.
- c) Annual insurance costs steadily rise.
